NOTE:



We now have property tags available at the club. If you need to <u>temporarily</u> leave property at the club please tag it with your name, date, and phone number. This will let the Bridge, Yard, Bulkhead, Dock or House Chairs know who the property belongs to. This <u>does not</u> replace the requirement to put your name permanently on your trailer.



The property tags are stored in the cabinet directly next to the refrigerator. These are not allweather tags. They can stand up to the elements for only a short time.

Why would I leave property at the club?

- Imagine you are bringing your boat for launch in the Spring. You don't normally store your trailer at the club. But you
 need to leave it for a day or two. Not a problem. Tag it!
- Imagine that you are loaning some tools to a fellow club member. "I'll just leave the toolbox at the club for you to pick up." Tag it!
- Imagine that you have talked to Jan about donating a small boat and trailer to the club. You tow it to JRSC and leave it in the yard. Tag it!
- Imagine that annoying cousin of yours has decided to visit for a week. You don't want him in your house and think that the JRSC basement couch is the best place for him. Tag him! (Just not on his big toe...that means something different.)

We will also be tagging existing items that appear abandoned and we don't know who they belong to. If you see a new tag on something you left at the club, please let the appropriate chairperson know it is yours. Add your name to the tag. Help us identify personal property that doesn't belong to the club.

Storage at JRSC for these types of items is only a temporary courtesy. When you can, please take your things home.



Just a reminder. If you are not working a bar shift during an event, please **do not** go behind the bar to get your own drink. Many of us are guilty of this because we think we are helping out the bartender or we've become impatient when the bartender is temporarily away from their post. But this actually becomes a liability issue for the club when non-working members pour their own drinks. This applies to mixed drinks, beer, and wine.



If you jump behind the bar to help out during a busy period...that's fine (and highly encouraged). After the rush, just go back to being a patron when you are finally able to order your own drink.
