



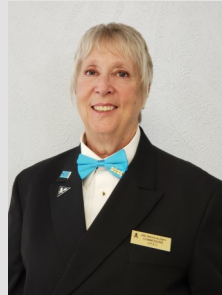

As many know, Ken Sabin joins me frequently at the end of the dock when I am the RC for Thursday Night Racing. Kenny is usually busy with his camera, taking photos bound for Facebook and the "Skulldugger". After the sailboats go downriver and out of sight, the camera is set aside, and we have time to talk.

Last year we were reminiscing about the many friends we've both made sailing...at times sadly speaking about those who have passed away. "You know," Kenny said, his eyes fixed on the far shore, "The weather rail is getting thin."

That phrase struck me. There was a profundity here. I've thought about Ken's words frequently over the past several months. "The weather rail is getting thin."

To non-sailors that phrase is nearly meaningless. To sailors it takes on a significance...full of substance and melancholy. Those six words continue to haunt me.

We've all been there. That first time or two sailing...when your value to sailboat and skipper is defined by your mass. Railmeat. The lowest form of life on a racing boat. There you are, hiking out on the weather rail.

What a great sport this is. What outstanding people sail this lake. Life is good! Especially when I am with my friends...up here on the weather rail.

Elizabeth (Ann) T. Lotshaw of Waterville, a former Anthony Wayne Schools teacher who was an authority on Waterville history, died June 13 at StoryPoint Waterville. She was 95.

She died of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, said Leslie Jan, a daughter.

"She was a strong-willed, fiercely independent woman, who cared about her family and her community," the daughter said, adding that Mrs. Lotshaw provided home care for her late husband, Elmer Lotshaw, for many years after he fell and suffered a serious brain injury.

A memorial service will be scheduled at a later date.

The family suggests tributes to the Waterville Historical Society, the Toledo Humane Society, the Toledo Zoo, or the Toledo Museum of Art.

VESSEL SAFETY CHECK

The purpose of the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is to assure that the vessel is in compliance with State and Federal requirements. In other words, that the vessel is equipped to operate safely on our waterways. VSC is free and takes fifteen to thirty minutes to complete, contingent upon the length and type of vessel. Vessels that meet VSC requirements are awarded a decal, an indication to other boaters that the vessel meets minimum requirements to operate safely.

VSC Decal Requirements

- ⇒ Display of Registration number
- ⇒ State/Federal Registration Documents
- ⇒ Personal Flotation Devices
- ⇒ Visual Distress Signals
- ⇒ Fire Extinguishers (must be less than 12 years old)
- ⇒ Ventilation (gasoline inboard engines)
- ⇒ Backfire Flame Control (gasoline inboard engines)
- ⇒ Sounding Producing Devices
- ⇒ Navigation Lights
- ⇒ Pollution Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)
- ⇒ MARPOL Trash Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)
- ⇒ Marine Sanitation Devices
- ⇒ Navigation Rules (vessel 39.4 ft. and over)
- ⇒ State /Local Requirements

Reservations must be made over the phone.

To avoid the madness at the PIB city docks, we always stay at Middle Bass and take the water taxi over to South Bass for the on-shore regatta events.

If you stay at Middle Bass, you may take a credit of \$4.00 per linear foot of your boat. You take this credit when paying for the regatta online.

Junior sailing has been going well. On June 14, we had 11 juniors show up for sailing. Before the Juniors went on the water they were shown how to dock. Each student was required to practice docking multiple times. Since many of the boats had damage to the front, Les (Lashaway) thought it was very important that they learned how to dock. This new skill will be reinforced over the summer.

Les took students on his boat who had not sailed previously. They all were able to steer the boat and understood the basics of tiller operation. Six of the students sailed their own Optis and we had a crew of 3 in a 420. The students were able to make the boats move but at this point don't understand any sail trim basics. Les had the two youngest on his Laser and was working with them on confidence.

Safety was of utmost importance and we had 2 chase boats on the water at all times. Each boat had 2 members in the boat. I stayed on the shore to assist with kids docking and putting boats in and taking them out.

One safety concern that was raised was cutting power to the docks. Phil showed me how to cut the power and that was done prior to putting any boats in the water. Starting next week, we will have Becky (Aumiller) back on Tuesday nights. At this point we seem to have enough help. We have Les doing instruction on the water, 2 chase boats in the water, and myself onshore with parents helping rig and put boats in and take them out. Within the next two weeks I would like to see the juniors rig their own boat with parents looking on.

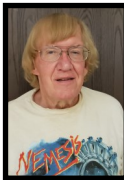
I am going to purchase some snacks and water to have at post sailing debriefing. I don't think the kids drink enough water and they need to be encouraged to take water with them on the boat.

I am viewing this year as a learning year due to the fact that I have no experience with the Juniors. Working with them is very enjoyable and as I learn the kids, I will be able to tailor the program to their needs.

--- One hour orientation, going over safety procedures, what to wear, and matching you with the right instructor who fits your schedule. (We have boats available from 18 feet to 35 feet in length, and will match you with the right sailboat based on your comfort level and goals for the class. Our larger boats sail out of Curtice, Ohio and La Salle, Michigan.)

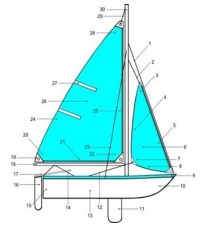
--- Ten hours of classroom instruction (spread out over five Mondays – 7:00 to 9:00 pm). The US Sailing text “Basic Keelboat” is on loan to you for study during your time in the course.

--- Six hours of on-the-water, hands on, instruction.

(Your six hours of instruction can be taken in two 3-hour outings, or three 2-hour outings; weekdays, weeknights, or weekends. We are flexible and can match you with the instructor that fits your schedule.)

--- One hour graduation reception that reviews the lessons you've learned, explains how easy (and relatively inexpensive) it is to own a sailboat, and tells you what your next steps are along the road to becoming a sailor.

Space is limited. Reservations and pre-payment are required.

Eligibility: Racing is open to all sailors who wish to race. JRSC membership is not a requirement. PHRF handicaps are not required for the Open Class. In the Open Class, competitors will be assigned a base handicap if they do not have a current PHRF-LE rating certificate. All applicable One Design rules for each fleet will be enforced. All participants must carry and provide a copy of insurance on their boats in order to race. Racers under 18 years of age must provide written parental permission to race.

Racing Notes: Scoring will be based on a High Points Scoring System. All of a vessel's finishes will be scored.

There are no throw outs. The race course will be determined by weather conditions and capabilities of the class. Multiple races per night will be scheduled if conditions allow. One completed race will constitute a series. A minimum of three boats will constitute a class.

Awards/Scoring: For the series, awards will be presented to the 1st place finisher in classes of three boats, the 1st and 2nd place finishers in classes of four boats, or the 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place finishers in classes of five or more boats.

I understand, acknowledge and agree to hold harmless the Race Committee, Jolly Roger Sailing Club, its officers, or any individual so associated, from any liability, for accident, damage, illness, or injury of any kind for my participation in the race(s). I agree to comply with all the rules governing the race(s). 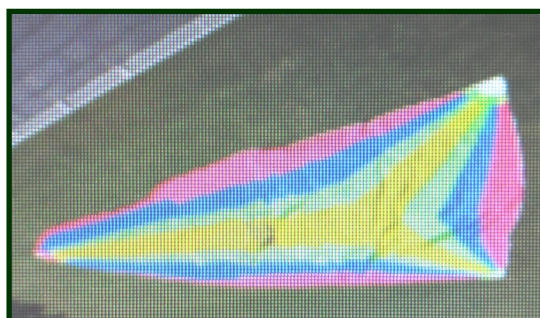
