



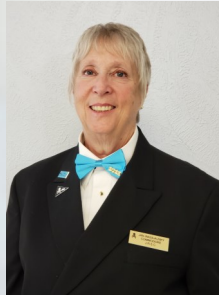

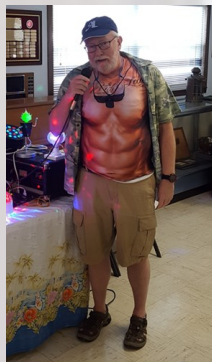

The True (and Enlightening) Story of the Transformation of Phil

Anyone who knows me, knows how modest I am. I really don't like talking about myself. <Insert laughter here.>

But I want to tell you about two Phils. They are Phil BC - "Before Caring" and Phil AD - "Active & Dedicated".

Phil BC was a bit of a jerk. He joined Jolly Roger in 2003. He treated JRSC like a marina and not like a club. He just wanted the least expensive place to dock his Catalina 22. He did the bare minimum of required work hours. He never attended a meeting and couldn't tell you who the officers were.

Outside of a few Catalina sailors, Phil BC hardly knew anyone at JRSC. On the rare occasion that he did walk through the clubhouse, he mumbled the mantra, "Don't make eye contact. Don't make eye contact." He feared that someone might ask him to volunteer for something...or worse yet...befriend him.

Now Phil AD is an entirely different guy. He learned people's names. He did so many work hours that he lost track of the total. He started caring about his fellow members. He attended meetings. He spoke up. (And when he did, people rolled their eyes.) He had to look up the definition of "loquacious".

Phil AD became the Membership Chair and a fierce advocate for the club. He took over Adult Sailing. He stepped up to be Vice Commodore. His head swelled to the size of a melon...wait...what?

Phil BC was transformed into Phil AD, the guy you know and love today. ***He didn't change our club...the Jolly Roger Sailing Club changed him.***

Now my metamorphosis is not a new phenomenon. Currently JRSC has about twenty AD's that used to be BC's. And the club has created hundreds of AD's over 75 years. But AD's grow old. AD's get tired...burnt out. AD's retire. Currently we have many, many more BC's in JRSC than there are AD's. And twenty AD's can't do it all. Pearson Hall was recently given a face-lift by only a handful of AD's. Where were the BC's?

"Club enthusiasm has reached an all-time low along with membership, boats in the water, etc. One has only to look down the dock at all the empty dock spaces or call a work party and no one shows up to see this. I am as guilty as the rest of you, my only excuse is the lack of a 30 hour day instead of just 24 as we all are allotted. What is your excuse?"

That was from a memo titled "Commodore's Quarterly Report", sent to members in July of 1963 by PC Paul Valigosky. Unlike the JRSC of 60 years past, I think our morale is high. (Just look at the recent Luau as an example.) But we are still facing the same BC / AD problems that plagued the club long ago.

"Oh it's fine," I can hear the BC's saying. "See, this JRSC story isn't new. This boat can still make shore with just a few members rowing while the rest of us lean back and enjoy the ride." Really BC? Really? Is that the role you want to play? Passenger?

Look at this from a non-JRSC perspective. Consider this scenario. There is a family of ten, all living under one roof. There's Dad and Mom, Nana and Papa, and six kids of various ages.

Mom does the cleaning. Dad sits on the couch and watches TV. Mom does the cooking. The kids are playing computer games. Mom does the laundry. Papa and Nana are napping. (Or whatever old people do in their spare time...I really wouldn't know.)

How happy is this family? Not very. Mom does all the work, while the other nine do what they want. How often does Dad get...ummm...you know. How sustainable is this model? This, like back in 1963, is where the Jolly Roger Sailing Club is today.

So if you haven't figured it out already, here's my message: ***If you are a BC, you need to become an AD.*** Step up! This is not a marina. This is YOUR club. The old saying "Many hands make light work" is true. And JRSC needs your many hands.

Believe me, Phil AD is a much happier person than Phil BC was. Busier...yes, but now with something much more important to me than just a JRSC membership card in my wallet. Along my BC/AD journey I have made dozens of club friends that are as dear to me as family. That's priceless.

So attend a JRSC social event. Join a committee. We currently need a House Chair...volunteer. Tend bar. Learn about your fellow members. (We don't bite.) Come to a meeting. Speak up. Run for an office. Don't write a check to pay for your work hours...do them! Start caring about your club and its future.

Please, please don't let this message fall on deaf ears. Let's all pull together. The Jolly Roger Sailing Club...**our club**...only gets better when we all get involved.

Lecture over. Phil AD out!

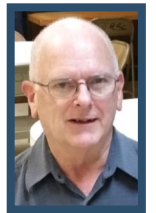

VESSEL SAFETY CHECK

The purpose of the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is to assure that the vessel is in compliance with State and Federal requirements. In other words, that the vessel is equipped to operate safely on our waterways. VSC is free and takes fifteen to thirty minutes to complete, contingent upon the length and type of vessel. Vessels that meet VSC requirements are awarded a decal, an indication to other boaters that the vessel meets minimum requirements to operate safely.

VSC Decal Requirements

- ⇒ Display of Registration number
- ⇒ State/Federal Registration Documents
- ⇒ Personal Flotation Devices
- ⇒ Visual Distress Signals
- ⇒ Fire Extinguishers (must be less than 12 years old)
- ⇒ Ventilation (gasoline inboard engines)
- ⇒ Backfire Flame Control (gasoline inboard engines)
- ⇒ Sounding Producing Devices
- ⇒ Navigation Lights
- ⇒ Pollution Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)
- ⇒ MARPOL Trash Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)
- ⇒ Marine Sanitation Devices
- ⇒ Navigation Rules (vessel 39.4 ft. and over)
- ⇒ State /Local Requirements

Adult Sailing 2022

One of the best ways for JRSC to recruit new members has always been through our adult sailing program. We will be offering two sessions of our “Learn to Sail” program again this year. The program has expanded and will include a one hour orientation, roughly ten hours of classroom instruction, six hours on the water, and a final hour long graduation reception. We want to get students out on the water, put a tiller in their fist, and sheets in their hands.

Session One:

Orientation on June 6th (7pm)

Classroom instruction on most Mondays (7pm) throughout the session

On-the-water (six hours) based on student and instructor availability

Graduation reception on July 25th (7pm)

Session Two:

Orientation on August 1st (7pm)

Classroom instruction on most Mondays (7pm) throughout the session

On-the-water (six hours) based on student and instructor availability

Graduation reception on September 26th (7pm)

This is another ambitious goal for 2022, building on the success we had with the program last year. Neil Whitehead will be in charge of classroom instruction. He has a great curriculum planned for 2022. We also received an educational grant last year and have all new textbooks.

What do I need from you? I need members willing to take students out on the water, either in a club boat or on your own vessel.

This will require a minimum eight hour commitment from you (which **will** count for club “work hours”). You will need to attend the orientation (where you will be matched with your students) and then spend six hours on the water with those new sailors. You do not have to be at the weekly classroom instruction, but you are welcome to attend and assist. You will also need to be at the one hour graduation reception where we will hopefully convert your students into new members.

The “Learn to Sail” program is flexible regarding your actual time on the water. Students normally request either three 2-hour sails, or two 3-hour sails. Weekdays, weeknights, or weekends --- the schedule is up to you and your students. Once you have been matched with your students, you will be their main contact point and the ambassador for JRSC.

With the launching of several of our club boats this spring, we will be able to teach students on those vessels. Remember, the ultimate goal is to get students to join JRSC, buy a boat, and place it on our docks. That being said, teaching them to sail on an 18 to 22 foot boat shows them that sailing is affordable and within their new skill set. But if you feel more comfortable teaching students on your own larger boat, that is acceptable. Instructors (and students) have options.

The initial orientation will take place on Monday, June 6 at 7:00 pm. You will have seven weeks until the graduation reception on Monday, July 25 to get all of the on-the-water instruction completed. I will provide you with a check list of the skills you will need to impart to your students. The second session will begin the week after the first class graduates.

In addition, if your student is interested in racing, ask them to crew with you (if you have room). But don't count this as part of their six hours of instruction. You won't actually have time to teach them anything. This will be bonus time on-the-water for them. (And it's a great way to develop future crew.)

We are also planning several fun races and short cruises throughout the summer for our general membership. If you are planning on participating in any of these events, feel free to invite your students. Again, don't count this as part of their six hours of instruction. These events are a great way to get students involved with JRSC outside of the course itself.

Are there any other ways you can help? Yes! Included in this month's Skulldigger is a one page flyer. Print it out. Take it to work and pin it to the bulletin board. Give it to a friend. Take it to your PTA meeting. You get the idea. Any exposure we can get is great for JRSC.

Please let me know if you can volunteer for the "Learn to Sail" program. I will be able to start signing up students when I know how many skippers are available.

So email me as soon as possible with the following information:

Your contact information

Your boat (name, size, location), or

If you wish to teach students on one of our club boats

The number of students you would feel comfortable teaching

Your availability (Session 1, Session 2 or both)

If you can assist with Monday classroom instruction (not mandatory)



It is imperative that I quickly know how many of you can volunteer as on-the-water instructors. In the past we have rarely turned away a potential new sailor. With enough volunteer instructors, we won't have to turn away any students this year.

Final note: I know eight + hours is a lot to ask. But I can think of no other time expenditure that has a greater chance of encouraging new sailors and gaining new members. And is there a better way to earn work hours than by taking people sailing?

ADULT SAILING COURSE - LEARN TO SAIL !

Experience sailing on the Ottawa River or Lake Erie with one of our veteran instructors. Experience the joy of boating without the roar of a motor. Learn how sailboats harness the wind and what it's like to glide silently across the water. Whether you want to know what it takes to own a sailboat, want to learn about cruising, want to dip your toe into the competitive world of sailboat racing, or just want to see how relaxing it can be to spend time on the water, let our group of instructors from the Jolly Roger Sailing Club introduce you to sailing.

The Jolly Roger Sailing Club course includes:

--- One hour orientation, going over safety procedures, what to wear, and matching you with the right instructor who fits your schedule. (We have boats available from 18 feet to 35 feet in length, and will match you with the right sailboat based on your comfort level and goals for the class. Our larger boats sail out of Curtice, Ohio and La Salle, Michigan.)

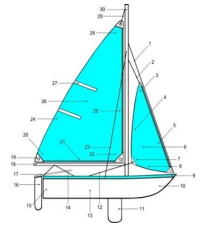
--- Ten hours of classroom instruction (spread out over five Mondays – 7:00 to 9:00 pm). The US Sailing text “Basic Keelboat” is on loan to you for study during your time in the course.

--- Six hours of on-the-water, hands on, instruction.

(Your six hours of instruction can be taken in two 3-hour outings, or three 2-hour outings; weekdays, weeknights, or weekends. We are flexible and can match you with the instructor that fits your schedule.)

Eligibility: Racing is open to all sailors who wish to race. JRSC membership is not a requirement. PHRF handicaps are not required for the Open Class. In the Open Class, competitors will be assigned a base handicap if they do not have a current PHRF-LE rating certificate. All applicable One Design rules for each fleet will be enforced. All participants must carry and provide a copy of insurance on their boats in order to race. Racers under 18 years of age must provide written parental permission to race.

Racing Notes: Scoring will be based on a High Points Scoring System. All of a vessel's finishes will be scored.

There are no throw outs. The race course will be determined by weather conditions and capabilities of the class. Multiple races per night will be scheduled if conditions allow. One completed race will constitute a series. A minimum of three boats will constitute a class.
