

LAST BASH 2022



When Judy and I started the Last Bash to The Bay, it was meant to be an opportunity for Cruising Sailors to have one last cruising weekend on their boats before putting them on the hard for the winter. As I have mentioned in the past, the destination for the very first Last Bash, twenty-seven years ago, was Oak Point State Park at Put In Bay, Ohio. Everyones' waterlines were quite a bit shorter than they tend to be today. Within a year or two, we had moved the rendezvous to Miller Marina across Squaw Harbor which gave us many more and larger docks to fill. In addition, the Last Bash was moved up about a month to the weekend after the fifteenth of September, which usually afforded us better weather for the sail there and home. Judy and I never realized at that time that the Last Bash Rendezvous would take on a life of its own and last for twenty-seven years and counting.

Over the years, The Bash has had as many as twenty-six boats and as few as three. On Saturday of the weekend, after lunch, we all would congregate at Heineman's Winery, where all "Virgin Bashers" (first timers to the party,) were introduced. If my memory serves me correctly, one of our gatherings had nearly seventy-five people in attendance. I remember too that our record of bottles drank was one hundred and eight, another record that still stands today. Then as is now, many attendees would take the Jet or Millers to the Bay, walk down to our party, some stayed the night others left when their ferries did. Then back to the Marina for a cookout and the Last Bash Captain Morgan Cup would be awarded to the boat that sailed the longest distance, and/or the Skipper traveling the farthest distance to get to the event. The skippers name, Boat name, and year were inscribed on the cup, awarded to the winner with the understanding they would return it at the next year's Bash. Years later, a separate award was given to the winner and the cup itself was mounted on a finished plaque that hangs in the club.

In later years due to Covid, Marina availability, or other unforeseen situations, the Rendezvous destination was changed to Middle Bass State Park and after that to Meinke Marina, where this year's event took place. Friday evening, dinner was at the Bilge Restaurant. With over thirty-seven members and guests in attendance, we found ourselves adding several chairs at the various tables to seat everyone. Eventually, everyone got fed and plenty of drinks were available for a number of us who imbibed a little. Saturday morning, breakfast was moved to Past Commodore Ray Gall and Lady Barb's nearby home, where everyone chipped in to cook and wash dishes. After all was cleaned up, the crowd went on about their normal activities and returned to the docks about 4 pm to begin dinner and once again enjoy a number of bottles of home-made wine donated by Jerry and Sharon Scheuerman. As people began to arrive at the docks and the numbers grew, we lit the grill and began eating. We estimated the attendance at between fifty-five and sixty folks.

This year's Last Bash Cup recipient was Diane Silas, along with her crew, Vince Hebert, who sailed her boat, Foxy, from the Jolly Roger docks to Meinke's to join the festivities. CONGRATULATIONS TO DIANE AND VINCE.

Great food and even better fellowship were enjoyed by all. The day closed with a bonfire that ended the evening around 11:30 pm. Next year's destination will be announced in the Skulldugger early in 2023. Be sure to make plans to attend and save the date. It is guaranteed that you will enjoy the weekend....

Mallory continues to represent her Jolly Roger history at every event she attends- spreading joy, learning, and racing every race to the end and helping others along the way.



Mallory Dietsch has been sailing since she was six years old. Through the years, she has honed her skills, falling in love with the wind and the water and the independence the sport affords.

Jolly Roger Sailing Club is where Mallory learned to sail. The club instilled in her a passion, patience, and love of the sport. Jolly Roger Sailing Club even supported Mallory and her teammates to travel to an international Optimist regatta, in Italy. She is also a member of the Junior Race team at North Cape Yacht Club.

Each weekend, for 8 weeks throughout the summer, Mallory can be found traveling to a regatta held anywhere from Erie, PA, to Columbus, OH and back to Grosse Ile, MI. All sailors are responsible to bring their own gear including personal boat, sails, and any equipment needed. Teams work together to coordinate trailering the sailboats and any safety boats needed for each event.

Every year, in the region, there is a regatta held over two days that is a qualifying event for the Chubb U.S. Junior National Championship. The 2022 event was held in Sandusky in challenging conditions. The first day, after only 2 races, the sailors were called in to port due to high winds. The sailors were sailing in winds of upwards of 30mph as they headed into the dock. The following day, the wind was barely 8mph. This year, Mallory qualified to represent Area E in the National Championship.

The boat Mallory sails is a single-handed boat. She competed in the Chubb U.S. Junior National Championship that was held on Lake Michigan, hosted by the Macatawa Bay Yacht Club in Holland, MI. The 4-day event consisted of 1 practice day and 3 days of racing with Lake Michigan conditions. One day the waves were measured at 7ft. with winds again gusting over 30mph. While the next day, there was a postponement of over an hour waiting for the wind to fill in.

At the Chubb U.S. Junior National Championship, she was awarded the **Faye Bennet Sportsmanship Award**, a perpetual trophy awarded to the singlehanded sailor (*if any*) who exhibits the highest tradition in fairness during the regatta.



Mallory is continuing her sport into the fall and is participating in MISSA regattas either skippering or crewing on double handed boats throughout the Midwest. This is a league of coordinating high schools hosting events through October. She also sails as crew on a 30 ft Capri Keelboat.

She has taught at North Cape Yacht Club's Learn to Sail program over the past two seasons as well as with kids at Devil's Lake Yacht Club.

She is working to incorporate her love of the water and boats into her long-term career choice. Mallory will be pursuing a degree of Maritime Transportation.
