VESSEL SAFETY CHECK

The purpose of the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is to assure that the vessel is in compliance with State and Federal requirements. In other words, that the vessel is equipped to operate safely on our waterways. **VSC is fast and free.** A vessel safety check (VSC) can be completed with the boat on the hard or in the water. Vessels that meet VSC requirements are awarded a decal, an indication to other boaters that the vessel meets minimum requirements to operate safely. Make a vessel safety check a routine prior to the first sail.

VSC Decal Requirements

1. Display of Registration number

Permanently attached
Block style, at least 3 inches high
Color contrasting with background

2. State/Federal Registration Documents

Registration or documentation paper available on board
Documented vessel's name and hailing port on display on the hull

3. Personal Flotation Devices

Coast Guard approved
In serviceable condition
Readily available
Suitable size for each person on the vessel
Throwable devices readily available (ring, horseshoe, buoyant cushion)

4. Visual Distress Signals

Three (3) day and night pyrotechnic devices
Electronic SOS beacon may replace night pyrotechnic devices
Distress flag

5. Fire Extinguishers

Extinguishers older than 12 years must be replaced with newer 5-B or 10-B or 20-B
Fixed extinguishing system must have an up to date inspection tag
Vessels less than 26 ft. and built before 2018 may carry B-I and B-II extinguishers, no older than 12 years

6. Ventilation (gasoline inboard engines and enclosed fuel compartments)

Build after 1980 must have powered ventilation system
Prior to 1980, natural ventilation is acceptable

7. Backfire Flame Control (gasoline inboard and inboard/outboard engines)

Acceptable means of backfire flame control
Attached to air intake with flame-tight connection

8. Sounding Producing Devices

Installed horn or hand-held horn
Bell
Whistle (not athletic whistle)

9. Navigation Lights

Red/Green bow
White stern
White running
White anchor (independently switched)

10. Pollution Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)

10. MARPOL Trash Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)

11. Marine Sanitation Devices

Coast Guard approved
Overboard discharge outlet must be sealed

13. Navigation Rules (vessel 39.4 ft. and over)

14. State /Local Requirements

15. Overall boat condition

Deck free of hazards
Bilge reasonable clean

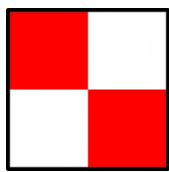
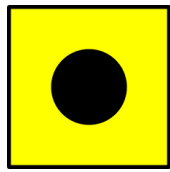
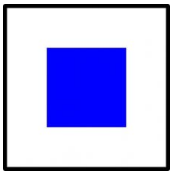

Greetings Friends:

Great News: Sailing cruises were last held in 2015. Currently, there is renewed interest in having a week-long cruise to such locations as Put-in-Bay, Middle Bass Island State Park, Sandusky Cedar Point, Huron Boat Basin, Vermillion, Lorain, Cleveland, Catawba Moorings, Kelley's Island, Port Clinton, downtown Toledo (Maritime Museum of the Great Lakes), Bolls Harbor, Ford Yacht Club, Detroit, Lemington, Canada, etc. While this list of destinations is long (and not all inclusive) we would be selective in which ones we can sail to in a 7, 8, or 9-day itinerary.

Great News: One day or a weekend short-duration cruises are also a possibility. Such as Maumee Bay, other Yacht Clubs on the Maumee River, Anchor Point/Meinke Marina, Cooley Canal Y.C., N.C.Y.C. Again this list too is long for a one or two day itinerary.

A planning meeting was held on March 7, to consider dates and desired destinations. Attached is the information sheet and sign-up form from that meeting which focused on a nine-day cruise to Lake Erie ports of call for the sailing vessels of JRSC. As of this date no forms have been sent to, despite 6 or 8 persons expressing interest in attending such an event.

A follow-up meeting addressing short-itinerary trips, as well as any questions about the 9-day trip, will be held April 11, at 6PM, prior to the monthly General Meeting. All are welcome to attend.

Meeting Agenda

What is it? Fleet of JRSC Sailboaters sailing together as a fleet to various ports on Lake Erie. This is not a race, but a cruise navigating from one location to another, practicing good seamanship practices with spouses, family members, and friends as crew members. All live aboard their vessels for the duration of the cruise.

Why? We do it for the fun and challenges of sailing and living aboard our own vessels. It should be done for the satisfaction of sailing our vessels “cross-country” and “camping” aboard while having the satisfaction of visiting new “towns”.

Ports of Call. Various ports which may or may not include the following: Put-In-Bay and the islands, Port Clinton, Huron, Vermilion, Cleveland, the Catawba peninsula, Sandusky, Downtown Toledo, Toledo Beach, Bolls Harbor, Gross Isle, Pelee Island, Leamington, Wheatley and Erieau in Canada.

Docking Facilities: We dock at night (no night sailing), sail in daylight only. Docking will be at AYC, I-LYA member-affiliated club facilities if available, or commercial marinas.

Dates: August 11/12, 2023; July 14/15, 2023

Duration: Maximum duration will be 10 days. Actual duration will vary depending on total distance between starting location and return. Multiple days at popular destinations may be scheduled as well as “weather days” to allow for any occasional day when sailing may be unsafe due to stormy or excessive winds.

Distances: Total distance traveled may exceed 100 miles (statute miles on Great Lakes). Daily miles traveled is determined by direct “line of sight” distances from port to port which may vary from 0 to nearly 30 miles.

Going Underway: Depending on distances to next port, the fleet should prepare to get underway typically between 7 and 9AM each sailing day. Vessel will remain 2-3 miles of each other to guide newer skippers.

Itinerary: Itinerary will be determined to allow any Captain to “jump in” at any of several ports if they and their crew can not travel the whole route due to home constraints.

Reservations: Intentions to sail with the fleet must be made AS SOON AS POSSIBLE with the Fleet Captain. Some marinas require reservations 30 or more days prior to arrival date. Some require deposits be made to ensure a reservation.

Communications: We will communicate by cell phone when necessary, but be aware, sometimes there “dead” spots on the lake where cell service is poor or non-existent. Cell calls are private, between two phones normally. VHF marine radio can be heard by anyone on the Lake. While sailing we will all monitor channel 9 at all times for hailing purposes, and, if traffic is scarce during weekdays, very, very brief messages. Never use 16 except for emergency hailing. For longer conversations, switch up to 68, 69, or 72. Specific hailing channels are monitored by marinas so that each of us can confirm dock assignments upon arrival.

Docking: Upon arrival, we will help each other tying up, or getting underway, especially “newbies”, or if wind is blowing off the docks.

Meals: In port we will coordinate several “potluck” dinners—be prepared to have a dish to pass. At some locations we will go out to eat *en mass*. (At all times you are required to report to the Fleet Captain the location of ice cream shops!)

Registration: A form will be available to relay necessary information about you and your vessel. Information is needed by marinas to assign docks, and by us to communicate with each other. This info, when compiled and distributed to each Captain, is to be treated as confidential to the group and to be given to persons outside the fleet only on an as needed basis due to phone numbers contained there upon.

Fleet Burgee: To identify all Fleet vessels to be designed. Also, a tee shirt and/or ball cap? For camaraderie.

Registration Fee: \$15, \$25?? Fee to cover Burgee and/or any awards, etc.

Awards: Determine a criteria for awards to vessel, skipper, crew. Incentives for fun?

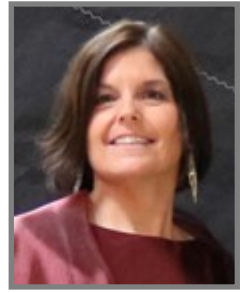
Safety Equipment: Flares, PFD's, throwables, reefing sails.

Dock Equipment: Dock lines, knots for tie-up, power line, water line.

Emergency Procedures: Man overboard, heavy weather, collision, radio procedures.

Log Book: Document your trip.

Adult Sailing is Almost Upon Us

One of the best ways for JRSC to recruit new members has always been through our adult sailing program. We will be offering two sessions of our “Learn to Sail” program again this year. The program has expanded and will include a one hour orientation, roughly ten hours of classroom instruction, six hours on the water, and a final hour long graduation reception. We want to get students out on the water, put a tiller in their fist, and sheets in their hands.

Session One:

- Orientation on June 5th (7pm)
- Classroom instruction on most Mondays (7pm) throughout the session
- On-the-water (six hours) based on student and instructor availability
- Graduation reception on July 24th (7pm)

Session Two:

- Orientation on July 31st (7pm)
- Classroom instruction on most Mondays (7pm) throughout the session
- On-the-water (six hours) based on student and instructor availability
- Graduation reception on September 25th (7pm)

This is another ambitious goal for 2023, building on the success we had with the program last year. PC Neil Whitehead will be in charge of classroom instruction. He has a great curriculum planned for 2023. We will also be providing textbooks to all students this year.

What do I need from you? I need members willing to take students out on the water, either in a club Catalina 22, club FJ, or on your own vessel.

This will require a minimum eight hour commitment from you (which **will** count for club “work hours”). You will need to attend the orientation (where you will be matched with your students) and then spend six hours on the water with those new sailors. You do not have to attend any weekly classroom sessions, but you are welcome to attend and assist. You will also need to be at the one hour graduation reception where we will hopefully convert your students into new members.

The “Learn to Sail” program is flexible regarding your actual time on the water. Students normally request either three 2-hour sails, or two 3-hour sails. Weekdays, weeknights, or weekends --- the schedule is up to you and your students. Once you have been matched with your students, you will be their main contact point and the ambassador for JRSC.

With the availability of two club Catalina 22s and four FJs this spring, we will be able to teach students on those vessels. Remember, the ultimate goal is to get students to join JRSC, buy a boat, and place it on our docks or bulkhead. That being said, teaching them to sail on an 13 to 22 foot boat shows them that sailing is affordable and within their new skill set. But if you feel more comfortable teaching students on your own larger boat, that is acceptable. Instructors (and students) have options.

The initial orientation will take place on Monday, June 5 at 7:00 pm. You will have seven weeks until the graduation reception on Monday, July 24 to get all of the on-the-water instruction completed. I will provide you with a check list of the skills you will need to impart to your students. The second session will begin the week after the first class graduates.

In addition, if your student is interested in racing, ask them to crew with you (if you have room). But don’t count this as part of their six hours of instruction. You won’t actually have time to teach them anything. This will be bonus time on-the-water for them. (And it’s a great way to develop future crew.)

We are also planning several fun races and short cruises throughout the summer for our general membership. If you are planning on participating in any of these events, feel free to invite your students. Again, don’t count this as part of their six hours of instruction. These events are a great way to get students involved with JRSC outside of the course itself.

Are there any other ways you can help? Yes! Included in this month’s Skulldugger is a one page flyer. Print it out. Take it to work and pin it to the bulletin board. Give it to a friend. Take it to your PTA meeting. You get the idea. Any exposure we can get is great for JRSC.

Please let me know if you can volunteer for the “Learn to Sail” program. I will be able to start signing up students when I know how many skippers are available.

So email me as soon as possible with the following information:

- 1) Your contact information
- 2) Your boat (name, size, location), or
- 3) If you wish to teach students on one of our club boats
- 4) The number of students you would feel comfortable teaching
- 5) Your availability (Session 1, Session 2 or both)
- 6) If you can assist with Monday classroom instruction (not mandatory)

It is imperative that I quickly know how many of you can volunteer as on-the-water instructors. In the past we have rarely turned away a potential new sailor. With enough volunteer instructors, we won’t have to turn away any students this year.

Final note: I know eight + hours is a lot to ask. But I can think of no other time expenditure that has a greater chance of encouraging new sailors and gaining new members. And is there a better way to earn work hours than by taking people sailing?

ADULT SAILING COURSE - LEARN TO SAIL !



Experience sailing on the Ottawa River or Lake Erie with one of our veteran instructors. Experience the joy of boating without the roar of a motor. Learn how sailboats harness the wind and what it's like to glide silently across the water. Whether you want to know what it takes to own a sailboat, want to learn about cruising, want to dip your toe into the competitive world of sailboat racing, or just want to see how relaxing it can be to spend time on the water, let our group of instructors from the Jolly Roger Sailing Club introduce you to sailing.

The Jolly Roger Sailing Club course includes:

— One hour orientation, going over safety procedures, what to wear, and matching you with the right instructor who fits your schedule. (We have boats available from 18 feet to 35 feet in length, and will match you with the right sailboat based on your comfort level and your goals for the class. Our larger boats sail out of Curtice, Ohio and La Salle, Michigan.)

— Ten+ hours of classroom instruction (spread out over six Mondays – 7:00 to 9:00 pm). You will receive a copy of the US Sailing text “Basic Keelboat” as part of your tuition.

— Six+ hours of on-the-water, hands on, instruction.

(Your six hours of instruction can be taken in two 3-hour outings, or three 2-hour outings; weekdays, weeknights, or weekends. We are flexible and can match you with the instructor that fits your schedule.)

— One hour graduation reception that reviews the lessons you've learned, explains how easy (and relatively inexpensive) it is to own a sailboat, and tells you what your next steps are along the road to becoming a sailor.

Space is limited. Reservations and pre-payment are required.

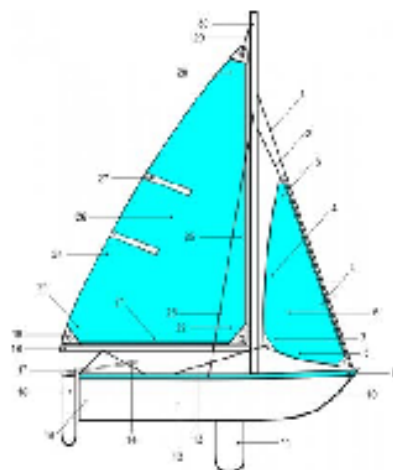

The 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing will apply unless contradicted by the Sailing Instructions.

Racing Notes: Scoring will be based on a High Points Scoring System. All of a vessel's finishes will be scored. There are no throw outs. The race course will be determined by weather conditions and capabilities of the class. Multiple races per night will be scheduled if conditions allow. One completed race will constitute a series. A minimum of three boats will constitute a class. Should conditions dictate, the racing venue may be moved out to the bay.

Awards/Scoring: For the series, awards will be presented to the 1st place finisher in classes of three boats, the 1st and 2nd place finishers in classes of four boats, or the 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place finishers in classes of five or more boats.

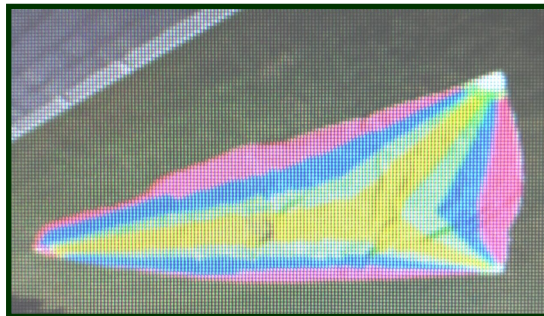
