The JRSC Fall Series is open to the Catalina 22 Class, Interlake Class, Wayfarer Class, all PHRF boats (with valid PHRF-LE certificate), and all JAM boats (with valid PHRF-LE certificate). A minimum of three boats will constitute a class. There will be two venues. Yachts participating in the PHRF or JAM Classes will race a roughly windward/leeward course using the fixed North Cape Yacht Club marks. Catalina 22's, Interlakes, and Wayfarers will race in the Ottawa River and Bay, with the starting line just off of the JRSC docks. Registration will take place at the Skipper's Meeting. Class splits, class flags, and specific Sailing Instructions will be announced at the Skipper's Meeting and posted online at www.noticeofrace.net. The Race Committee will monitor Channel 71.



RESTRICTED ENTRY AS PROVIDED BY ITILE 33, CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS IS BEING ENFORCED. ALL PERSONS MUST STAY CLEAR OF THESE ZONES DURING PERIODS OF FIRING ACTIVITY. BOATERS, FISHERMEN. AND AIRCRAFT PILOTS SHOULD REFER TO THE NOAA MARINE NAVIGATIONAL CHART #14830 AND THE DETROIT AIR SECTIONAL CHART RESPECTIVELY FOR EXACT BOUNDARIES. THE CAMP PERRY STROBE LIGHT LOCATED AT 41° 32' 15" N AND 083° 01' 00" W WILL BE ACTIVATED AND RED RANGE FLAGS DISPLAYED DURING CONDUCT OF FIRING, ALL PERSONS MUST STAY OUTSIDE THE BOUNDARIES MARKED AS RANGE "DANGER ZONE I" AND RANGE "DANGER ZONE II", SHOWN ON THE CHART (CAMP PERRY FIRING RANGE) ATTACHED HERETO. THESE BOUNDARIES AFFECT TWO DANGER ZONES: LAKE ERIE DANGER ZONE LEXTENDS 3.5 MILES OFFSHORE INCLUDING THE AIRSPACE TO 5,000' ABOVE GROUND LEVEL (AGL) AND MAY BE IN USE BETWEEN 6 A.M. AND 6 P.M. DAILY, INCLUDING WEEKENDS, DURING THE ENTIRE CALENDAR YEAR OF 2023. LAKE ERIE DANGER ZONE II EXTENDS 10 MILES OFFSHORE INCLUDING THE AIRSPACE TO 23,000' AGL. FIRING IN THIS ZONE IS NORMALLY CONDUCTED BETWEEN 8.A.M. AND 5 P.M., MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY. EXTENSION TO THESE HOURS WILL BE PUBLISHED UNDER A SEPARATE NOTICE. DURING THE BOATING SEASON, THESE ZONES ARE NORMALLY MARKED WITH ORANGE AND WHITE BUOYS BEARING THE WORDS "RANGE DANGER ZONE". THE 2023 RANGE ACTIVITY WILL NOT REQUIRE THE TOTAL USE OF DANGER ZONE II. CONSEQUENTLY, A MODIFIED DANGER ZONE II FOR 2023 WILL BE IDENTIFIED BY A SERIES OF 14 BUOYS PLACED ON A WEST TO EAST LINE, APPROXIMATELY TWO AND ONE-HALF MILES SOUTH OF USCG BUOYS A, B AND C. THE AREA NORTH OF THIS LINE OF BUOYS WILL BE SAFE FOR MARINERS DURING PERIODS OF FIRING INTO DANGER ZONE II (SEE CHART). MARINERS DESIRING GENERAL INFORMATION ON NAVIGATION OR PUBLIC USE OF THESE ZONES SHOULD CONTACT THE CAMP PERRY RANGE SAFETY OFFICE ON MARINE VIIF CHANNEL 16, OR TELEPHONE 614-336-6203 OR 614-336-6252 FOR SPECIFIC FIRING SCHEDULES. 

Tracking Harmful Algal Blooms in Lake Erie with an Uncrewed Surface Vehicle

In August 2023, NOAA's Great Lakes Environmental Research Laboratory and its partners will deploy a *SeaTrac* Uncrewed Surface Vehicle (USV) platform in western Lake Erie. This deployment will correspond with NOAA's weekly harmful algal bloom (HAB) monitoring program.

What should we expect to see?

While out on western Lake Erie and the Maumee Bay, you may see a yellow and black "vehicle" on the water, called a *SeaTrac*. The *SeaTrac* will move by itself along the surface of the water to and from predetermined points. At these points, it will pause and take measurements from different depths in the water, using sensors attached to the platform. If you encounter the USV, please do not touch it. Check out the information on the back of this sheet for more on how this vehicle works.

Why is it out there?

Nuisance blooms and toxic harmful algal blooms (HABs) are common in Lake Erie. Monitoring HABs in locations that are close to shore (such a swimming and fishing areas, drinking water intakes, etc.) is important. However, these areas also pose a challenge for a number of reasons, including shallow water depths, limited access to sampling locations, and difficult environmental conditions. The shallow draft of this USV will allow access to these locations in western Lake Erie for sampling as well as detailed mapping and toxin detection in Maumee Bay, where HAB toxin concentrations are typically high.


The development of a system that can access these shallow areas and transmit information to researchers and resource managers in near real-time will support timely decision-making for protecting public health and mitigating other HAB impacts. This advanced technology will also provide additional information that can be used in bloom and toxin forecasts. These efforts help advance NOAA's important decision support tools, such as the Lake Erie Harmful Algal Bloom Forecast.

How it works

The boat is electric: it gets energy from the sun, and stores it in large batteries, enabling it to operate through varying weather conditions. The boat is autonomous: it runs programmed missions that can last from several hours up to several months. It normally makes decisions on its own, but it supports "person in-the-loop" and can be remotely controlled. Missions can be easily changed on the fly.

While out on the water, you may encounter the SeaTrac. The vehicle will stop if an object (boat, bird, person, etc.) is located near it. Once it senses that the object has moved, it will continue on its mission. If you do encounter the SeaTrac this summer, feel free to watch it as it moves around the lake collecting important information. However, we request you do not attempt to interact with or touch the USV and please stay at least 25 feet from it when in the water. This will ensure that our missions are not jeopardized and, most importantly, that you remain safe.

Experience sailing on the Ottawa River or Lake Erie with one of our veteran instructors. Experience the joy of boating without the roar of a motor. Learn how sailboats harness the wind and what it's like to glide silently across the water. Whether you want to know what it takes to own a sailboat, want to learn about cruising, want to dip your toe into the competitive world of sailboat racing, or just want to see how relaxing it can be to spend time on the water, let our group of instructors from the Jolly Roger Sailing Club introduce you to sailing.

The Jolly Roger Sailing Club course includes:

- --- One hour orientation, going over safety procedures, what to wear, and matching you with the right instructor who fits your schedule. (We have boats available from 18 feet to 35 feet in length, and will match you with the right sailboat based on your comfort level and your goals for the class. Our larger boats sail out of Curtice, Ohio and La Salle, Michigan.)
- --- Ten+ hours of classroom instruction (spread out over six Mondays 7:00 to 9:00 pm). You will receive a copy of the US Sailing text "Basic Keelboat" as part of your tuition.
- --- Six+ hours of on-the-water, hands on, instruction.

(Your six hours of instruction can be taken in two 3-hour outings, or three 2-hour outings; weekdays, weeknights, or weekends. We are flexible and can match you with the instructor that fits your schedule.)

--- One hour graduation reception that reviews the lessons you've learned, explains how easy (and relatively inexpensive) it is to own a sailboat, and tells you what your next steps are along the road to becoming a sailor.


