Well, the calendar has turned another page (or flipped to another screen) and end-of-season is closing in on us. Saturday, October 28 – Finger Dock Removal continues.

If Finger Dock Removal moves slowly, we have inclement weather, or we don't get enough volunteers...we may also need to work on a Sunday as well. There will also be a Yard Work Party sometime this Fall. Stay tuned.

Now on to the fun stuff. In addition to the "Change of Watch" on November 4th (please contact me if you have not received your evite yet), there will be another event honoring our members. The "Membership Appreciation Party" recognizes those among us who go the extra mile...err...extra hour...and exceed the required number of work hours. They don't stop at eight, or at sixteen. It's that time of year again... the weather is getting cooler and fall is in the air.




other assorted goodies. Following breakfast and clean up, some enjoyed games while others opted for a sailing experience aboard members' boats. It was a nice day to sail.

New and Upcoming Tech available

I am Javier Villar, manager of SportAndGps. I would like to introduce to you our TELEMETRY OVERLAY software product.

There, you will find many tutorials and examples of videos generated by our customers. First, some images from some nautical users on different regattas and scenarios:



TELEMETRY OVERLAY is a **Windows, Mac and Linux app**, which allows to you to create and add an overlay (heading display) on your ships and yachts videos recorded with different devices, as: **GoPro**, Insta 360, mobile phones, **DJI drones**, **activity watches** and other devices, as well as **SAILMON** and Expedition software.

GPS data, gyro, accelerometers and other sensor data are extracted from the MP4 file, on those cases where the manufacturer has embedded the sensor info inside the MP4 file. Otherwise, you will need an external data logger, as activity watches, smartphones, data loggers from the motor sector, etc.

It is a postprocessing app. Even if you do not have recorded a video, but just an external GPS data, you can create a video with a neutral background and the GPS info. The info the user can add to the video are about 150 gauges, approx. Updating rate of those parameters is until 0.1 second. In order to make easier the desired gauges selection, we have created 20 templates or patterns for different activities. Each pattern has 8 or 10 gauges that we think they fit better to each activity. Finally, the user can add, delete and setup the aspect of each one of those gauges. Then user can save his preferred pattern as default and when he will open a new video, **TELEMETRY OVERLA**Y will automatically create and will add the overlay to the original video.

Sport or activity can be any one developed on open spaces involving movement: sailing, canoeing, kayaks, surfing, drones, aircrafts, helicopters, planners without motor, motorcycling, biking, skiing, cars, parachuting, paragliding, BASE jump, military vehicles, balloons, snowmobiles, quads, carts, heli -ski, canyoning, ziplines, mushing, in all different modalities.

GPS Path over a map and/or satellite image with different zoom levels, position on the path, altitude, lean angle, pitch angle, coordinates, bearing, speed (2D and 3D), speed profile, air speed, instant and total distance (2D and 3D), date/time, stopwatch, instant slope, vertical speed, home distance, acceleration, some scopes.... about 150 different gauges (from different sensors, not just GPS). We are permanently adding new functionalities demanded by our customers or by our own initiative.

After app installation and key introduction, you just need to open a MP4 video file and on a few seconds, you can see graphic results over your video. Number of gauges and aspect of them will be the one you have setup on your pattern.


