Hello Jolly Roger family

WOW! Another new year has begun and I hope that the holidays were filled with joy for you. If you did not attend the ugly sweater and cookie exchange party you missed some great fun and fellowship. This month, corn hole and euchre tournaments begin. Later in the month is the chili cookoff, and of course, don't forget the luncheon outings that take place every month.

With the new year the countdown for launching our boats begins. Plans for the maintenance and or

repairs to our boats are put into motion. Should you be new to sailing this past year after taking our sailing courses, I encourage you to try your hand at racing this year.

There will be an event on January 13th for a very specific member of our club who is in need of our help. Please plan on attending this fund raiser and if not consider a donation to this cause.

This month's column may seem a bit mundane due to its simplicity. I know some members have gone through the sailing classes. Some members are old saults. There are members like me who need a refresher course due to not being able to remember what you had for dinner yesterday.

Everywhere there are rules for something that you will engage in. This month I would like to go over the rules of the water. I know, I KNOW! some will say I already know these rules. Hey for those who have a good understanding of them, maybe the person next to you at the next meeting may not. I write this column for them. So below are those rules for the ones like me.

1. Always maintain a proper lookout by sight as well as hearing to avoid colliding with other boats

2. Maintain a safe speed at all times so that you remain in control of your boat

3. Use common sense when assessing risk of collision with other boats near and around you

4. Port tack gives way to starboard tack: If two sailboats are approaching each other and the wind is on a DIFFERENT side of each boat, then sailing rules are that the sailboat which has the wind on the port side must always give right of way to the other. (The port side is the left-hand side of the boat when you are facing the front.)

5. Windward gives way to leeward: If two sailboats are approaching each other and the wind is on the SAME side of each boat, then sailing rules are that the vessel which is to windward (the direction of the wind) must give the right of way to the vessel which is leeward (the opposite direction of the wind).6. If you are at risk of colliding with another boat and all else fails, then agreed sailing rules

are that whichever boat has the other boat on its starboard side must yield right of way. (The starboard is the right-hand side of the boat when you are facing the front.)

7. Any vessel overtaking another should always keep out of the way of the vessel being overtaken.8. A sailboat should always keep out of the way of any boat that is: a) not under command, b) restricted in its ability to maneuver, and c) engaged in fishing

9. When passing through a narrow channel, sailing instructions are to keep as close to the outer edge as possible.


10. Non-commercial powerboats usually give way to sailboats, unless the sailboat is

overtaking it. However, general sailing instructions are also that sailboats should try to stay out of the way of large vessels and ferryboats that may find it harder to slow or change direction—especially in narrow channels.

# ERICA'S STORY



We are raising funds to help our daughter, Erica Scully, while she recovers from hip replacement surgery. She is 31 years old and has been unable to work a steady job since August when she collapsed, fell and broke her shoulder. While that is seemingly just an accident, this was different. The reason for the fall was she could not put any weight on her left hip, it hurt too much, the pain unbearable, collapsing to the floor and landing on her shoulder.

This began a series of doctor's appointments to try and discover the reason for the pain in her hip. Originally diagnosed with a strained ligament and receiving treatment for that, the pain was still intense. She tried going to a chiropractor thinking that would help align her joints and begin to relieve the pain, alas this made things worse.

She was finally able to talk to an osteopath who scheduled an MRI, which was denied by her insurance company which wanted her to go through 3 months of rehabilitation in the form of physical therapy. After a call from her physician, the insurance company agreed to the MRI.

The MRI indicated that the ball joint on the end of her femur was decaying due to a lack of blood flow, this is called Avascular Necrosis and is the underlying cause of her pain. The only solution is hip replacement surgery. We are waiting for the procedure to be scheduled, meanwhile her bills keep piling up and her dad and I are stretching our budget thin to help her keep up. Her recovery, once the operation is performed, could be 6 months or more.

We are asking for donations to help with these expenses, please give what you are able, it will be used wisely and for a good cause.
