This month's column is about THE BENEFITS OF SAILING. Sailing is an exceptional sport in terms of the benefits it can bring to an individual. Here are just a few of the widely recognized benefits of our sport:

**Muscle strength and endurance**: The many activities involved in sailing, like pulling and hoisting of sails to maneuver a boat or a yacht, adds to your muscle strength for your shoulders and back.

**Cardiovascular fitness**: Sailing can also improve your cardiovascular health and reduce the risk of hypertension, obesity and other heart illness. This is because of the large amount of oxygen uptake that happens when you engage in intense activities.

Mental wellness: Being out on the water puts you in a good mood not just because of the calmness of the water but because of the fresh air. The swooshing and splashing of water, the rhythmic movement of the boat and the sound of the wind in the sails can all affect brainwave patterns. This relaxes and soothes a busy and highly stressed-out mind.

**Increases agility**: The various tasks associated with sailing also help improve your flexibility and agility. Activities like pulling lines and moving around and keeping yourself stable on a moving boat can significantly improve your hand-eye coordination and motor skills.

**Improves concentration**: Because many people today are chronic multi-taskers, they should develop a deep sense of concentration. With the ultimate goal of staying safe while on board, sailing enhances a person's ability to focus even with multiple tasks at hand.

**Improves communication skills**: To effectively control a boat, the captain and his crew must act as a unified unit. To do this they need to learn how to communicate effectively, especially through non-verbal means. Everyone on board has a crucial role to play in order to keep the ship afloat.

Whether you be a young or old sailor these traits above make us stronger and healthier. The bonds of camaraderie and friendship while doing this sport long outweigh any pressure of the outside forces that can plagues us with stress.

# VESSEL SAFETY CHECK

The purpose of the Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is to ensure that the vessel is in compliance with State and Federal requirements that it is equipped to operate safely on our waterways. **VSC** is fast and free. A VSC can be completed with the boat on the hard or in the water. Vessels that meet VSC requirements are awarded a decal, an indication to other boaters and to enforcement authorities that the vessel meets minimum requirements to operate safety. Make a vessel safety check a routine prior to the first sail.

## **VSC Requirements**

- 1. Display of Registration number
  - Permanently attached
  - · Block style, at least 3inches high
  - · Color contrasting with background
- 2. State/Federal Registration Documents
  - · Registration or documentation paper available on board
  - Documented vessel's name and hailing port on display on the hull
- 3. Personal Flotation Devices
  - Coast Guard approved
  - · In serviceable condition
  - · Readily available
  - · Suitable size for each person on the vessel
  - · Throwable devices readily available (ring, horseshoe, buoyant cushion)
- 4. Visual Distress Signals
  - · Three (3) day and night pyrotechnic devices
  - · Electronic SOS beacon may replace night pyrotechnic devices
  - · Distress flag
- 5. Fire Extinguishers
  - Extinguishers older than 12 years must be replaced with newer 5-B or 10-B or 20-B
  - · Fixed extinguishing system must have an up to date inspection tag
  - · Vessels less than 26 ft. and built before 2018 may carry B-I and B-II extinguishers, no older than 12 years
- 6. Ventilation (gasoline inboard engines and enclosed fuel compartments)
  - · Build after 1980 must have powered ventilation system
  - · Prior to 1980, natural ventilation is acceptable
- 7. Backfire Flame Control (gasoline inboard and inboard/outboard engines)
  - · Acceptable means of backfire flame control
  - · Attached to air intake with flame-tight connection

- 8. Sounding Producing Devices
  - · Installed horn or hand-held horn
  - Bell
  - · Whistle (not athletic whistle)
- 9. Navigation Lights
  - · Red/Green bow
  - White stern
  - · White running
  - White anchor (independently switched)
- 10. Pollution Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)
- 11. MARPOL Trash Placard (vessels 26 ft. and over)
- 12. Marine Sanitation Devices
  - · Coast Guard approved
  - · Overboard discharge outlet must be sealed
- 13. Navigation Rules (vessel 39.4 ft. and over)
- 14. State /Local Requirements
- 15. Overall boat condition
  - Deck free of hazards
  - · Bilge reasonable clean

The items listed below are not required to pass a VSC but highly recommended.

- · Marine Radio
- Fire extinguisher(s) mounted in clear view
- Anchor and line
- · First aid kit
- · Inland Approved Visual Distress signals
- Nautical Charts

The 2024 JRSC Cattail Regatta (for adult One-Design Classes) will be raced on a windward / leeward course on Maumee Bay (alternative racing on the Ottawa River should weather conditions warrant).

# Registration Fee: \$30 per crewed boat (Catalina 22s, Interlakes, etc.) \$20 per boat for single crew boats

We will have bottled water and snack bags available free of charge for all participating crews. JRSC will be hosting a cook out after the race for \$15 per person (advance RSVP by email is required; please specify Steak or Chicken). Overnight camping for traveling crews is available beginning Friday night at no additional charge.

The Catalina 22 Class will be competing for the Bruce Sondys Memorial Trophy.

Racing for the Catalina 22 Class will be on both Saturday & Sunday.

The Interlake Class (Saturday only) will be competing for the Founder's Cup.

Although one race will constitute a series, we will attempt to run <u>three or more races</u> (weather conditions permitting). The exact format and starting order will be included in the Sailing Instructions (available at registration).

This regatta will be governed and scored per the 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescription of the One-Design rules, and the specific Sailing Instructions of this regatta.

The Cattail Regatta is open to all One-Design Classes with a minimum of three boats per class. Although we anticipate a Catalina 22 Class, Interlake Class, Sunfish Class, Laser Class, all other classes able to sail this venue are welcome.

1600 – 2300: JRSC parking lot open for arrival and boat storage for traveling crews.

# Saturday, June 1st (All Classes)

0800 – 1030: Registration, Rigging, and Launching.

1200: Start of First Class, Race 1. Races 2-3-4 to Follow. (No starts after 1600.)

1700: Awards and Dinner.

# Sunday, June 2nd (Catalina 22 Class only)

1055: First Warning Signal.

1100: Start of Catalina Class, Multiple Races. (No starts after 1300.)

1400: Awards.

The Cattail Regatta will primarily be sailed on a Windward / Leeward course in Maumee Bay, with the start and finish lines at the center of the course. The length and number of times around the course will depend on wind conditions and the performance capabilities of the Class. (Should weather conditions warrant, racing will be moved to the Ottawa River.) Exact details regarding the Courses, Class Start Times, etc. will be communicated at the mandatory Skipper's Meeting.

Registration will occur on the day of the event. We strongly suggest that you email us in advance if you plan to attend, so that we may have ample food on hand for all participants. Those dining with us after Saturday racing will need to specify steak or chicken for each attendee. Non-racers are welcome to join us for dinner.

Adult Sailing 2024

One of the best ways for JRSC to recruit new members has always been through our adult sailing program. We will be offering two sessions of our "Learn to Sail" program again this year. The program will include a one hour orientation, roughly eight to ten hours of classroom instruction, six hours on the water, and a final hour long graduation reception. We want to get students out on the water, putting a tiller in their fist, and sheets in their hands.

## Session One:

Orientation on June 3rd (7pm)

Classroom instruction on most Mondays (7pm) throughout the session

On-the-water (six hours) based on student and instructor availability

Graduation reception on July 22nd (7pm)

### Session Two:

Orientation on July 29th (7pm)

Classroom instruction on most Mondays (7pm) throughout the session

On-the-water (six hours) based on student and instructor availability

Graduation reception on September 23rd (7pm)

This is another ambitious goal for 2024, building on the success we had with the program last year. PC Neil Whitehead will be in charge of classroom instruction. He has a great curriculum planned for 2024. We will also be providing textbooks (US Sailing "Basic Keelboat") to all students this year. VC Jerry Gates will be instructing students during one of the Monday sessions on essential knots.

What do I need from you? I need members willing to take students out on the water, either in a club Catalina 22, club FJ, or on your own vessel.

This will require a minimum eight hour commitment from you (which <u>will</u> count for club "work hours"). You will need to attend the orientation (where you will be matched with your students) and then spend six hours on the water with those new sailors. You do not have to attend any weekly classroom sessions, but you are welcome to attend and assist. You will also need to be at the one hour graduation reception where we will hopefully convert your students into new members.

The "Learn to Sail" program is flexible regarding your actual time on the water. Students normally request either three 2-hour sails, or two 3-hour sails. Weekdays, weeknights, or weekends --- the schedule is up to you and your students. Once you have been matched with your students, you will be their main contact point and the ambassador for JRSC.

With the availability of two club Catalina 22s and a few FJs this spring, we will be able to teach students on those vessels. Remember, the ultimate goal is to get students to join JRSC, buy a boat, and place it on our docks or bulkhead. That being said, teaching them to sail on a 13 to 22 foot boat shows them that sailing is affordable and within their new skill set. But if you feel more comfortable teaching students on your own larger boat, that is acceptable. Instructors (and students) have options.

The initial orientation will take place on Monday, June 3 at 7:00 pm. You will have seven weeks until the graduation reception on Monday, July 22 to get all of the on-the-water instruction completed. I will provide you with a check list of the skills you will need to impart to your students. The second session will begin one week after the first class graduates.

In addition, if your student is interested in racing, ask them to crew with you (if you have room). But don't count this as part of their six hours of instruction. You won't actually have time to teach them anything. This will be bonus time on-the-water for them. (And it's a great way to develop your future crew.)

We are also planning several fun races and short cruises throughout the summer for our general membership. If you are planning on participating in any of these events, feel free to invite your students. Again, don't count this as part of their six hours of instruction. These events are a great way to get students involved with JRSC outside of the course itself.

Are there any other ways you can help? Yes! Included in this month's Skulldugger is a one page flyer. Print it out. Take it to work and pin it to the bulletin board. Give it to a friend. Take it to your PTA meeting. You get the idea. Any exposure we can get is great for JRSC.

Please let me know if you can volunteer for the "Learn to Sail" program. I will be able to start signing up students when I know how many skippers are available.

So email me as soon as possible with the following information:

- 1) Your contact information
- Your boat (name, size, location), or
- 3) If you wish to teach students on one of our club boats
- 4) The number of students you would feel comfortable teaching
- 5) Your availability (Session 1, Session 2 or both)
- 6) If you can assist with Monday classroom instruction (not mandatory)

It is imperative that I quickly know how many of you can volunteer as on-the-water instructors. In the past we have rarely turned away a potential new sailor. With enough volunteer instructors, we won't have to turn away any students this year.

Final note: I know eight + hours is a lot to ask. But I can think of no other time expenditure that has a greater chance of encouraging new sailors and gaining new members. And is there a better way to earn work hours than by taking people sailing?


